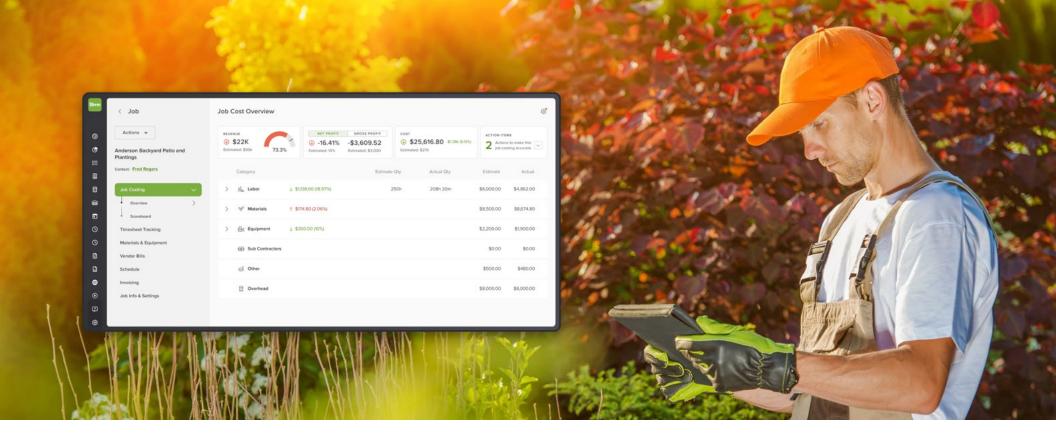




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Introduction

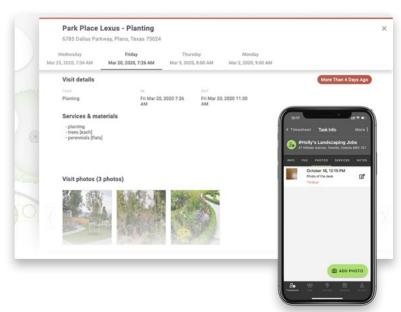
- 1. Can the software solve the frustrations and problems that I'm faced with on a day-to-day and annual basis?

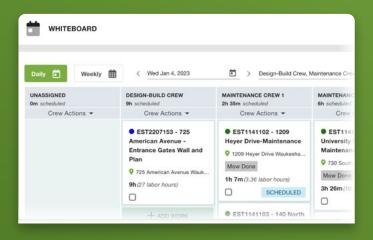
Can software reduce my liability?
